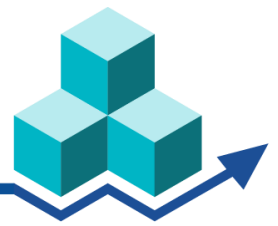




COOK COUNTY STARTING BLOCK GRANTS



Building Capacity, Supporting Growth

Equity in Grantmaking

In 2021, Cook County established a special purpose fund for Equity and Inclusion – [the Cook County Equity Fund](#). The Equity Fund is dedicated to addressing historic and continued disparities and disinvestment in Cook County. An Equity in Grantmaking Workgroup was convened and ultimately recommended \$5 million in initial funding for a capacity building grant initiative. The Cook County Justice Advisory Council (JAC) was selected to administer this grant initiative in partnership with the Office of the President. In 2023, Cook County is awarding \$5 million in Starting Block Grants funded via the Equity Fund (\$ 4 million) and the JAC Capacity Building budget (\$1 million).

Grant Overview

Cook County's Starting Block Grant initiative provides capacity building resources and support to community-based nonprofit organizations serving Cook County residents. Cook County Starting Block Grants support small to medium sized organizations looking to build internal capacity and develop their infrastructure to promote organizational health, growth and sustainability. This initiative goes beyond traditional grants for organizations to deliver services and allows them to focus on strengthening how they run, so that they can ultimately serve the community at a higher level. Starting Block Grants support organizational capacity building projects ranging from strategic planning to staff training, accounting, database and technology improvement and more.

The grant opportunity is opened to community-based organizations in diverse sectors, including Arts and Culture, Community and Economic Development, Education, Health and Human Services, and Violence Prevention. To be eligible to apply, organizations were required to be headquartered in Cook County, serving Cook County residents, have non-profit (501c3) status and an annual operating budget under \$1 million and have at least three years of experience working in communities.

Response & Selection Process

The JAC received 365 applications from organizations headquartered in 16 of the 17 Cook County districts. Trained interagency review panels, consisting of 53 reviewers across 24 departments, reviewed the 326 applications that passed the technical review. 148 applications were unanimously recommended by all reviewers and 51 top-scoring applicants were selected to receive a grant award.

Grant Awards

Awarded organizations will receive up to \$100,000 in funding for individualized capacity building projects over two years. Cook County will award Starting Block Grants to 51 organizations in December 2023, totaling \$4,983,029.13, with a subsequent grant award cycle planned for 2024.
