Your zip code can predict the quality of your education; how much money you'll earn over the course of your lifetime; and even your life expectancy.

United Way's 2020 ALICE research showed that 30% or more of households in Cook, DuPage, Kane, and Lake counties had difficulty meeting their basic needs *before* the pandemic. These ALICE households earn too much to qualify for most public assistance programs but not enough to weather an emergency. This is disproportionately higher in Black and Latinx communities, and the ongoing effects of the pandemic, economic turmoil, community violence, and other challenges continue to amplify these inequities.

#### It doesn't have to be this way.

All people across our city and region deserve equitable opportunities for success. We are working to make that possible by meeting basic needs, such as food, shelter, and access to healthcare, and transforming neighborhoods from the inside out.

There is an opportunity for us as a community to do more together. I'm fundamentally optimistic about what's ahead of us because we're committed and we're going to keep going.
