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SUMMARY

The Cook County Department of Planning and Development within the Bureau of Economic Development (the "County") currently receives Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) and Emergency Solutions Grant (ESG) funding on an annual entitlement basis from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD). The County proposes new CDBG-funded activities below to better meet community development needs in suburban Cook County. This requires Substantial Amendments to the 2014, 2015, 2016 and 2018 Annual Action Plans. This document, consisting of a narrative as well as required attachments, constitutes the formal Substantial Amendments to HUD. These amendments will advance the County's ongoing efforts to expend its CDBG funds expeditiously.

Project Scope	Supports the positive reuse of vacant land and responds to resident requests for neighborhood recreational space. The project will also provide playfields for the adjacent Lincoln-Gavin School. Six abandoned homes will be demolished as part of this project.
Initial CDBG Funding Committed	\$0
Proposed Change	Adding this project to the County's Action Plan, using \$250,000 of CDBG funding.
Additional Comments	The full project cost is estimated at \$750,000. It is one of the Early Action Activities stemming from a Choice Neighborhoods Planning Grant in Chicago Heights' East Side neighborhood.

Proposed Change	Adding this project to the County's Action Plan, using \$250,000 of CDBG funding.
Additional Comments	This is the first CDBG project that the City of Harvey applied for since 2015.

CDBG Funding Recipient	Village of Franklin Park
Project Type	Public Infrastructure: Franklin Avenue
Project Scope	Support the final design phase of Franklin Avenue reconstruction project. Franklin Avenue is a major road in the O'Hare Industrial Corridor. In 2023, Franklin Avenue will also serve as an exit route for the Elgin O'Hare I-390 and I-490 Western Access Project. Significant new industrial space has been added in the area, and additional economic development and job creation are expected.
Initial CDBG Funding Committed	\$0
Proposed Change	Adding this project to the County's Action Plan, using \$290,000 of CDBG funding.
Additional Comments	Total project cost is \$32,300,000, with a \$22,960,000 grant being received from the Illinois Competitive Freight Program. Cook County CDBG funding is one of many sources being used to complete this important project.

Project Scope	Support the replacement/upgrade of approximately 600 water meters village-wide which are outdated, faulty and inaccurate. This is a high priority of the Village, as substantial numbers of resident complaints are received about faulty meters and inaccurate readings.
Initial CDBG Funding Committed	\$399,750
Proposed Change	Adding \$227,483 of additional CDBG funding to this project.
Additional Comments	Bids came in significantly higher than anticipated, and the Village has requested additional CDBG funding to complete the project.
